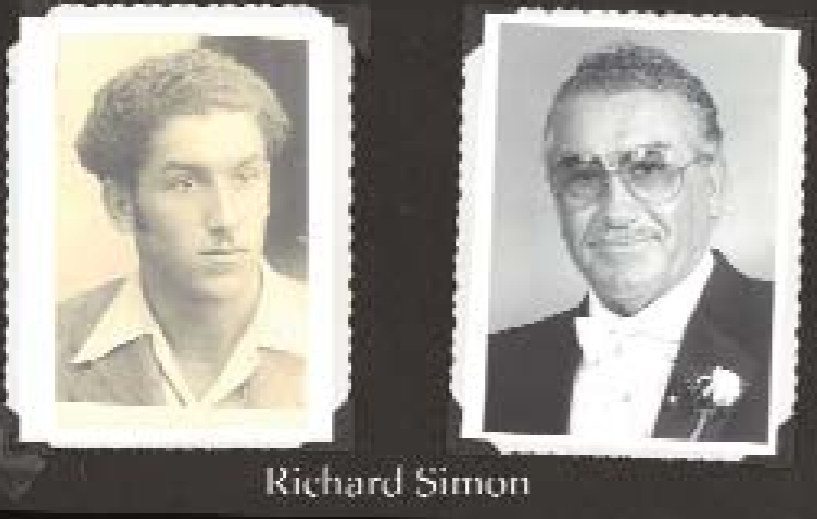
Services and Compassionate Support...

By offering a spectrum of services, the staff of the Center works to diminish the effects of Alzheimer's disease and dementia among seniors in Atlantic County.

Depending on an individual's needs, a team of professionals comprised of social workers, a psychologist, a dietician and a registered nurse, all experienced in dementia care, are available to meet with the senior to assess his/her needs. The team will then develop a personalized care plan to address the proper measures to keep the senior safe at home and in the community.

Our Story

In 2005, The Richard Simon Center for Alzheimer's was established at Seashore Gardens Living Center. The Center is named in memory of Richard Simon, a prominent community member who battled Alzheimer's disease for eight years. Richard's family and friends came together to promote The Richard Simon Center for Alzheimer's to serve as a grassroots community outreach program.

The goal of the Center is to offer services to enable seniors to remain at home by creating a safe environment through evaluations, monthly home visits, customized safety plans, and care coordination with community resources. The Center specializes in providing counseling, resources, and support to caregivers who are faced with dementia.

- **Timely Interventions** for caregivers and individuals with Alzheimer's (and related disorders) through an evaluation and counseling services
- **Guidance and Support** for community members through monthly support group meetings and workshops
- **Accessibility to Services** and treatment by providing timely referrals in an effort to utilize community resources
- **Ongoing Support** through telephone calls and one-on-one home visits with a social worker or a certified dementia practitioner
- **Senior Safety Watch Program** ensures that seniors with dementia who may wander are easily identified and protected through the Center's collaboration with Atlantic County police forces
- **Medication Education** with a pharmacist or registered nurse for the individual with dementia
- **Educate and Increase Awareness** about Alzheimer's and train professionals and community members through in-services and educational conferences
